➤ **NOTE:** A total of 122 s.h. of credit, including a minimum of 42 s.h. of upper-level credit is required for graduation. A minimum overall (cumulative) GPA of 2.00 is required for graduation.

➤ **NOTE:** In order to be eligible for Graduation you must fill in an Application for Graduation Form and return it to the Office of the Registrar (formerly Enrolment Services) by April 30 of the year prior to your completion (there is no fee to apply for graduation). When you have handed in your application for graduation, the Office of the Registrar will complete a graduation audit for you. This audit will confirm which courses are still outstanding in order for you to complete your degree.
