Over three decades of senior management experience, immersion in business theory and exposure to tomorrow's leaders through teaching at the world's top business schools, Karl Moore has maintained a fascination with what makes organizations and their leaders tick.

Karl, a former IBM senior manager, is a professor in McGill University's Desautels Faculty of Management, where he teaches in the MBA and executive programs and is co-director, with Henry Mintzberg, of the Advanced Leadership Program.

He is also an Associate Fellow of Templeton College at Oxford University, where he was full-time faculty between 1995 and 2000. A senior scholar himself Dr. Moore's publications include: 18 refereed journal articles, 9 books, 10 chapters in books and 25 executives articles. His research has received over 435 Google Scholar citations.
