➤ **NOTE:** In order to be eligible for Graduation you must complete an Application for Graduation via the Student Portal by July 15 in the year of your completion (there is no fee to apply for graduation). Once your complete application has been received, a degree audit will be completed for you. This audit will confirm which courses are still outstanding in order for you to complete your degree.
