TWU Coat of Arms

HISTORY

Officially assigned November 15, 1986.

MEANING

The shield contains the historical Trinity Cross rising from the BC sun. The shield is supported by an explorer, such as Simon Fraser, and by a Coastal Native carrying a talking stick. The protective helmet on top of the shield is the helmet of salvation, which supports a replica of the old Fort Langley on which the Hudson Bay flag is mounted, as the fort was established by the Hudson Bay Company. The shield rests on a base carrying the official British Columbian Dogwood flower. Over the crest is a banner with the phrase "A Mighty Fortress is our God" written in Latin.

USAGE

To authenticate the highest official University academic and legal documents (degrees, certificates, contracts).
