ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

English Language Requirements

Students are required to meet at least one of the following to be eligible for direct admission to TWU:

- 1 Be a native-speaker of English, from a country on the approved list at www.twu.ca/undergraduate.
- 2 An IB TOEFL score of 88 for undergraduate or 100 for most graduate programs.
- 3 Begin studies at TWU through ESLI program.

ESLI Pathway

No matter what level of English you currently have, Trinity Western has a place for you. With conditional admission to the university, you can begin your studies in our language training program (ESLI). There is no TOEFL requirement, so you can start right away! After successfully completing your studies with ESLI, you will be ready to begin your university studies at Trinity Western.



Undergraduate Academic Requirements

British Columbia Curriculum

English 12, plus three other approved academic subjects at 67% or higher. 60% on English 12 Provincial Exam is required. See www.twu.ca/undergraduate for detailed Provincial requirements.

UK Curriculum

Standing in five GCE subjects of which two must be at the Advanced (A) level or four at the Advanced Supplementary (AS) level. TWU grants transfer credit for select Advanced Level courses (with minimum grade of C).

US Curriculum

Graduation from an accredited high school with the following units in college prep work:

English	4
Mathematics	3
Social Sciences	2
Science	2 (with one lab science)
Other college prep	2

IB Diploma

Students who are in the process of completing the IB Diploma program may be considered for admission, based on their predicted grades. A total score of 24 is required for general admission to the university. TWU grants up to 18 semester hours of transfer credit for Higher Level IB courses (minimum score of 4 is required).
