➤ NOTE: A total of 122 s.h. of credit, including a minimum of 42 s.h. of upper-level credit is required for graduation. A minimum overall (cumulative) GPA of 2.00 is required for graduation.

➤ NOTE: In order to be eligible for Graduation you must fill in an Application for Graduation Form and return it to the Registrar's Office (formerly Enrolment Services) by April 30 of the year prior to your completion (there is no fee to apply for graduation). When you have handed in your application for graduation, the Registrar's Office will complete a graduation audit for you. This audit will confirm which courses are still outstanding in order for you to complete your degree.

Concentration in Art

An Art Concentration consists of 30 s.h. in Art (ART 181, 182, 411, 412; 6 s.h. of Art History; and at least 12 s.h. of 300/400 level ART courses).

Minor in Art

An Art Minor consists of 24 s.h. in Art, of which 12 s.h. must be 300/400 level ART courses. Choose one of the three Orientations:

- Historical Orientation: ART 125, 126, 181, 182, 327, 328, 390, plus 3 s.h. of ART at 300/400 level.
- Studio Orientation: ART 125, 126, 181, 182, plus 15 s.h. of ART (12 s.h. must be at 300/400 level).
- Design Orientation: ART 125 or 126, 181, 182, 250, 361, 362, 363, plus 3 s.h. of ART at 300/400 level (practicum recommended).
