FRENCH PREREQUISITES:

- > French Studies Concentration/Minor is for students who have completed Gr. 11 French or FREN 101, 102.
- Students with Gr. 12 French enter FREN 205, 206 and take the French Language and Literature Concentration/Minor if their Gr. 12 average in French is 75% or higher.
- Students whose Gr. 12 average in French is below 75% may enter FREN 111, 112, after consulting with the department if they feel unprepared to enter FREN 205, 206.
- With permission, students may take FREN 318 or 320 concurrently with FREN 306. One of FREN 318 or 320 must be taken as a prerequisite to the other upper level literature courses.

NOTES:

- A total of 33 s.h. of credit, including a minimum of 18 s.h. of upper-level credit is required to complete this Concentration. A total of 27 s.h. of credit, including a minimum of 12 s.h. of upper-level credit is required to complete this Minor. A minimum overall (cumulative) GPA of 2.00 is required for graduation.
- In order to be eligible for graduation you must complete an Application for Graduation via the Student Portal and submit a completed checklist to the Office of the Registrar by April 30 of the year prior to your completion (there is no fee to apply for graduation). Once your complete application has been received, a degree audit will be completed for you. This audit will confirm which courses are still outstanding in order for you to complete your degree.
