A total of 63 s.h. of credit with a minimum overall (cumulative) GPA of 3.00 are required for graduation. Courses for which the final grade falls below a B- will not be counted towards program completion.

In order to be eligible for Graduation you must fill in an Application for Graduation Form and return it to Enrolment Services by July 15th (there is no fee to apply for graduation). When you have handed in your Application for Graduation, Enrolment Services will complete a graduation audit for you. This audit will confirm which courses are still outstanding, if any, in order for you to complete your degree.
