TEACHING

The philosophy that underpins my teaching has been informed by many years of experience and expertise as a nurse within critical care, anesthetics, senior care, leadership and management in complex healthcare systems. I utilize my advanced clinical skills and knowledge in all my teaching. My teaching is centered on ensuring that I lead and teach by example regarding respect, dignity in provision of care, empathy, professionalism and ensuring the patient and their family is central to everything that we, as nurses undertake. I ground my teaching to ensure that patient-centered interdisciplinary care becomes embedded within the students' thinking and eventual nursing practice. My scholarly involvement with clinical experts in pain management, senior care and leadership informs my teaching, such that, students receive the most recent and up to date evidence-based knowledge. Moreover, entrenched within my teaching philosophy are concepts and attention to justice, diversity, equity and inclusion. Specifically ensuring safe and accessible care for all patients and their families, ensuring and teaching importance of and concepts of trauma informed care and attention to the lived experience of the patient. As well, this informs how I approach my students and their individual needs, ensuring my understanding and attention to the individual teaching needs of each student and attention to facilitating and ensuring diversity and equal access to education for all.

Over the past several years in senior executive positions for health authorities in BC, an aspect of these roles was as teacher and mentor, ensuring that I worked closely with professional practice and continuing my involvement with teaching planning and oversite. Specifically for newly graduated nurses coming into specialized areas such a pediatrics and critical care environments. During my tenure at BC Children's hospital the nursing resource team was a part of my portfolio, and this program was often accessed by new graduates that had an interest in pediatric nursing. Moreover, I was significantly involved in developing and enabling Nurse Practitioner (NP) practicums and providing support, experience and mentorship for NP students and newly graduated NPs to develop their skills and expertise to facilitate their transition into specialized NP roles.

Moreover, my experience as an executive health leader in various health authorities across BC has given me a broad understanding of health care delivery in BC and specific healthcare delivery challenges and opportunities. Much focus on enhancing healthcare delivery across BC has been on the adoption of health informatics including work involving preparation and development of electronic health records. As well, my experience of providing leadership during the Covid pandemic has allowed me to develop expertise in major incident planning.

During my time at UBC I taught the advanced nursing practice course within the Master of Science in Nursing program, and I have many years of experience working as an advanced nurse and students on the advanced nursing practice course benefit from my knowledge in this complex and ever-changing area of nursing practice. For the most part, my teaching at UBC has been in the area of adult and older adult care within the undergraduate program; I undertook extensive curriculum re-design and ensured that evidence-based teaching was provided which reflected current practice and health care requirements with an emphasis on chronic disease management. I was course lead for a key BSN theory/clinical 12 credit course over several years with a lot of workloads around student progressions. Within this course I introduced new content, such as anesthetics, chronic pain management, older adult abuse and neglect. Due to my critical care background and expertise, I provided teaching within this course with regard to chronic pain and anesthetics and surgery. I ensure that theory is presented within the context of clinical reality. Content of my teaching reflected changing society and the healthcare focus with regard to the ageing population and shifting focus from acute disease management within acute care to chronic disease management in the community.

I encouraged student participation in my seminars which promoted good communication, professionalism, critical thinking and teamwork. Central to my teaching role was developing practice academic collaborations and development of extensive networks with interdisciplinary care providers specifically in BC within the specialty of pain management and gerontology. I utilized my collaborations with clinical partners who have provided seminars within my courses in areas such as HIV/AIDS and cardiology.

My expertise in pain enabled me to provide teaching within other courses at UBC SoN and my background in critical care and pain has informed my supervision of many UBC SoN students whose focus of thesis is either pain or acute care, and support for graduate students from other disciplines such as kinesiology and psychology. The nature of pain and its complexities requires an interdisciplinary focus and lends itself well to interdisciplinary education and teaching.

As well, I worked as faculty lead to develop a clinical center of nursing excellence to promote and teach best practice in a hospital in Punjab, India. This work was an aspect of the partnership that UBC SoN had with Baba Farid Health Sciences University, Punjab, India and has been a critical opportunity to teach best practice and build practice and clinical collaborations with community engagement. I travelled to India with faculty and students several times to work with faculty in India to support UBC graduate students with their research, develop the clinical center of nursing excellence and have provided teaching with a focus on basic nursing care such as infection control and pain management.

SCHOLARLY AND PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES

Areas of special interest and accomplishments

My scholarship has a professional orientation, with the aim of enhancing and sustaining best patient outcomes with respect to chronic pain management and how it is integrated into professional systems of care. My aim is to improve clinical practice and enhance nursing care with the purpose of optimizing patient outcomes, especially regarding pain. Pain is a complex and individually experienced phenomena and one of my research goals is to provide patients with innovative tools to support their own self-management. Informed by my background as a senior pain clinician and nurse leader in several health environments, I focus on research designed to have a positive impact on patient care.

It is well recognized that available funding for research in the pain field is limited. For example, surveys in the USA and Canada reveal that <1% of the research budget available from US National Institute of Health (NIH) and the Canadian Institute of Health Research (CIHR), has gone toward pain research. This is especially so for research that has a focus on patient self-directed pain management as much of the available funds go to pharmacological developments. Therefore, I have relied on clinical partnerships and smaller grants to support my clinical research in the area of pain, and on more local knowledge dissemination approaches.

My current pain research is on the use of virtual reality (VR) for the management of chronic pain. The use of VR is a unique and novel approach to chronic pain management and the field is in its infancy. To develop the kind of knowledge that is much needed in this field, I am undertaking small case series studies, which will then inform further research. To support this work I have developed academic, clinical and industry partnerships, including collaboration and support from industry partners who have enabled the current case series (eg Occulus rift who have provided VR headsets, Cloud Head Game and Ether One have provided VR games). I have also developed community partnerships with organizations that support individuals living with chronic pain such as PainBC and the People in Pain Network (PIPN).

The current VR research builds upon competitive funding I secured for research investigating nurse assessment for neuropathic pain in the acute phase of injury, with the purpose of enhancing patient care and preventing development of chronic pain. The first study investigated the use of a neuropathic pain assessment tool, incorporated within a postoperative pain assessment sheet, which ensured that nurses undertook neuropathic pain assessment. The study findings demonstrated that nurses were able to identify patients with neuropathic pain in the immediate post-operative period and that some patients experienced neuropathic pain signs and symptoms in the acute phase of injury following surgery. As a direct outcome from these findings nursing practice across BC lower mainland has been changed to enable nurse assessment of neuropathic pain in post-operative patients. A follow on from this work was to investigate nurse assessment of neuropathic pain in burn injured patients. Following funding obtained from BC Burns Foundation Fund; in partnership with clinicians in BC, I undertook a study investigating prevalence of neuropathic pain in the acute phase of a burn's injury and nurses' assessment of neuropathic pain in this patient group. A manuscript of the findings was been accepted for publication in an International journal.
