- BBA students must achieve an overall 2.5 GPA in all of the Business, Economics, and Mathematics courses required in the first two years of study (minimum C grade in each course). Students failing to achieve this minimum must address this deficiency before commencing upper-level study in Business Administration.
- The 2.5 GPA must be sustained in all required Business and Economics courses taken at the upper level. A minimum C grade is required for each course as well as for IDIS 410 (or POLS/IDIS 393 if attending LLC).
- > A total of 122 s.h. of credit, including a minimum of 42 s.h. (36 s.h. in the major) of upper-level credit is required for graduation. A minimum overall (cumulative) GPA of 2.00 is required for graduation.
- In order to be eligible for graduation you must complete an Application for Graduation via the Student Portal and submit a completed checklist to the Office of the Registrar by April 30 of the year prior to your completion (there is no fee to apply for graduation). Once your complete application has been received, a degree audit will be completed for you. This audit will confirm which courses are still outstanding in order for you to complete your degree.
