Program of study eligibility

An eligible graduate program must include a significant research component that leads to the completion of a thesis, major research project, dissertation, scholarly publication, performance, recital and/or exhibit that is merit/expert-reviewed at the institutional level as a requirement for completion of the program.

Joint programs with a professional degree (for example, MD/PhD, DVM/PhD, JD/MA, JD/PhD, MBA/PhD, MA/MBA) as well as **clinically oriented programs of study**, including clinical psychology, are eligible if they have a significant autonomous research component, as described above.

Master's programs that are based only on course work are typically not eligible since they do not include a significant research component, as described above.

The intended objectives of the research must primarily be to advance knowledge in one or more of the natural science or engineering disciplines.

CIHR – Health

The intended outcomes of the research must primarily improve or have an impact on health and/or produce more effective health services and products and/or strengthen the Canadian health care system.

Special Circumstances

- Applicants can outline any special circumstances that have affected their performance or productivity.
 - For example, delays in disseminating research results due to health problems, family responsibilities, parental leave, disabilities, trauma and loss, or other applicable circumstances.
- Applicants may want to consider including disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, if applicable.
 - For example, lab access, equipment delays, family responsibilities, etc.
 - Should include an explanation about what was done to adjust or compensate in response to these impacts.



Outline of Proposed Research (1 page)

- A proposal needs to be written in plain-language that will communicate effectively to all readers.
- An **interdisciplinary** group of selection committee members will be evaluating your application. Some committee members will speak a different disciplinary "language", so your proposal needs to be written in lay terms.
- Ensure that your proposal provides a clear outline of your research, including, for example, the research question(s), context, objectives, methodology, and significance, as well as expected contributions to advancing knowledge.
- Consult with your supervisor when writing your proposal. The Office of Graduate Studies cannot assist applicants with writing their research proposals.



Bibliography and citations (1 page)

- Citations for all works referenced in the research proposal.
- Format used by the primary discipline of the proposed research.



Transcripts

Up-to-date official transcripts are required.

- Transcripts for the fall semester in the year of application must be included, whether they contain grades or not
- If transcripts include transfer credits from another institution, the original transcript with grades must be included
- Transcripts are used to confirm the number of months of graduate studies completed
- Transcripts are also used to determine first-class average and current registration



Transcript Key

A transcript key must be included for each institution for which a transcript is submitted.

Applications without transcript legends will not meet eligibility criteria.

If submitting electronic transcripts, applicants are responsible for contacting the respective university to obtain the legend. Pages from an Academic Calendar or equivalent are not accepted.

TRINITY WESTERN UNIVERSITY TRANSCRIPT KEY

Trinity Western University was established in 1962 and is chartered by the Province of British Columbia to grant degrees. The University currently offers Bachelors, Masters, and Doctoral (Ph.D., D.Min.) degrees. In 1969, it operated under the "Trinity Junior College Act" of the Province of British Columbia. An amendment to this act in 1972 provided for the name change to Trinity Western College. "The Trinity Western College Act" of 1977 authorized the four-year university program. The Charter amended by the Legislature of British Columbia in 1979 authorized the granting of baccalaureate degrees. In 1985, the Provincial Legislature authorized a name change to Trinity Western University. Trinity Western University is a member of Universities Canada.
