- A total of 122 s.h. of credit, including a minimum of 42 s.h. of upper-level credit ( 24 s .h. in the major) is required to complete this degree. Students must have a minimum overall (cumulative) GPA of 2.0 to graduate. Students seeking BC Kinesiology Association membership must complete a total of 30 courses in HKIN or Science, which may result in more than the 122 s.h. of credit required for graduation.
