- A total of 134 s.h. of credit, including a minimum of 54 s.h. of upper-level credit is required to complete this degree. A minimum of 36 s.h. of upper-level credit is required in the major. Students must have a minimum overall (cumulative) GPA of 3.0 in all Art + Design courses, as well as an overall (cumulative) GPA of 3.0 to graduate.
