- BBA students must achieve an overall 2.5 GPA in all of the Business, Economics, and Mathematics courses required in the first two years of study (minimum C grade in each course). Students failing to achieve this minimum must address this deficiency before commencing upper-level study in Business Administration. The 2.5 GPA must be sustained in all required Business and Economics courses taken at the upper level.
- A total of 122 s.h. of credit, including a minimum of 42 s.h. of upper-level credit (24 s.h. in the major) is required to complete this degree. Students must have a minimum overall (cumulative) GPA of 2.0 to graduate.
