- A total of 24 s.h., including a minimum of 12 s.h. of upper-level credit is required to complete a Minor, and a total of 30 s.h., including a minimum of 18 s.h. of upper-level credit is required to complete a Concentration. Students must have a minimum overall (cumulative) GPA of 2.0.
- You must complete an <u>Application for Graduation</u> via the Student Portal and <u>submit a copy of your filled in program checklist(s)</u> (i.e. this document) to the Office of the Registrar by April 30 of the year prior to your completion.
