- Students combining a Biblical Studies, ICRS, or CHRC minor/concentration with a Biblical Studies, ICRS, or CHRC major cannot double count the same course(s) in the major and minor/concentration. For example, RELS 111 and 112 are required in every RELS major, minor and concentration. Students must choose whether the semester hours for these courses will be applied to the major or the minor/concentration. If applied to the major, then the same amount of semester hours must be replaced (via courses taken) in the minor/concentration. Thus, every major must complete 42 s.h., every concentration 30 s.h., and every minor must complete 24 s.h.
- A total of 122 s.h. of credit, including a minimum of 42 s.h. of upper-level credit (24 s.h. in the major) is required to complete this degree. Students must have a minimum overall (cumulative) GPA of 2.0 to graduate.
