Students must choose whether the semester hours for these courses will be applied to the major or the minor/concentration. If applied to the major, then the same amount of semester hours must be replaced (via courses taken) in the minor/concentration. Thus, every major must complete 42 s.h., every concentration must complete 30 s.h., and every minor must complete 24 s.h.
- A total of 122 s.h. of credit, including a minimum of 42 s.h. of upper-level credit (24 s.h. in the major) is required to complete this degree. Students must have a minimum overall (cumulative) GPA of 2.0 to graduate.
