# Academic Accountability FAQ's

**Q1**

**How do you register for SKLS 001?**

You register for SKLS 001 in the student portal just like your other courses.

**Q2**

**I have already taken SKLS 001 and passed, do I have to take it again?**

No, once you've taken SKLS 001 and passed, you do not need to take it again.

**Q3**

**I already have a class scheduled in the time SKLS 001 is offered, what should I do?**

You will need to rearrange your class schedule or drop the conflicting class in order to make SKLS 001 a priority.

**Q4**

**When does SKLS 001 start?**

SKLS 001 starts the week of Add/Drop.

**Q5**

**I have taken SKLS 003 before and passed, do I need to take it again?**

Yes, SKLS 003 is important for your success and is required.



# Academic Accountability FAQ's

**Q6**

**I can't afford the \$500 for Success Coaching, what should I do?**

SKLS 003 is a requirement for this stage in your academic journey. Consider reducing your course load to accommodate the cost.

**Q7**

**I've registered for 15 semester hours already this semester. What do I do?**

You will need to withdraw from one of your courses as you are limited to taking 12 semester hours (plus 1 HKIN activity course).

**Q8**

**How do I get off Academic Accountability?**

Ultimately you need to get your career GPA to 2.0. For further information please see the Office of the Registrar.

**Q9**

**What does required to withdraw (RTW) mean?**

Required to withdraw means you will need to take 1 semester (6 months) off from university and reapply to return.

**Q10**

**Why should I repeat a failed course?**

Repeating a failed course is the quickest way to improve your career GPA.

**Q11**

**Where can I get help?**
