Proposed Policy Title: Graduate Studies Prior Learning Credit Policy

Rationale: To provide a written policy to govern the management of prior learning credits at the Graduate Level at Trinity Western University.

Purpose:

The objectives of this policy are to provide a point of reference for the adjudication of all requests for academic credit for prior learning for students enrolled in a Graduate Program of Trinity Western University.

Scope of this Policy: This policy would apply to all graduate level prior learning credits.

Policy Statement: Prior Learning credits for a Graduate Program of Trinity Western University can be granted based on the following criteria:

- Transfer credit (Where a graduate level transcript is available)
 - Course work was taught at the Graduate level at an appropriately accredited institution
 - A minimum grade of 'B' is obtained
 - A minimum of 50% of a graduate degree must be completed at Trinity Western University including the final summative project, thesis or graduating essay
 - Each graduate program will set their own maximum number of semester hours that can be granted by transfer credit

- Prior Learning Assessment (a graduate level transcript is not available) will not be applied to graduate programs at Trinity Western University.
- Under certain circumstances a specific course requirement may be waived but not the credit requirement. A graduate course requirement may be waived if the student has evidence of prior learning at an equivalent level from a recognizable institution. (e.g. a student may be waived the requirement to take a Law course in the MBA program if they already have a Doctor of Jurisprudence degree) However, the student will be required to replace the course with another suitable elective in order to meet the credit requirements of the program.
