Guest Speaker: Danielle Chatterton

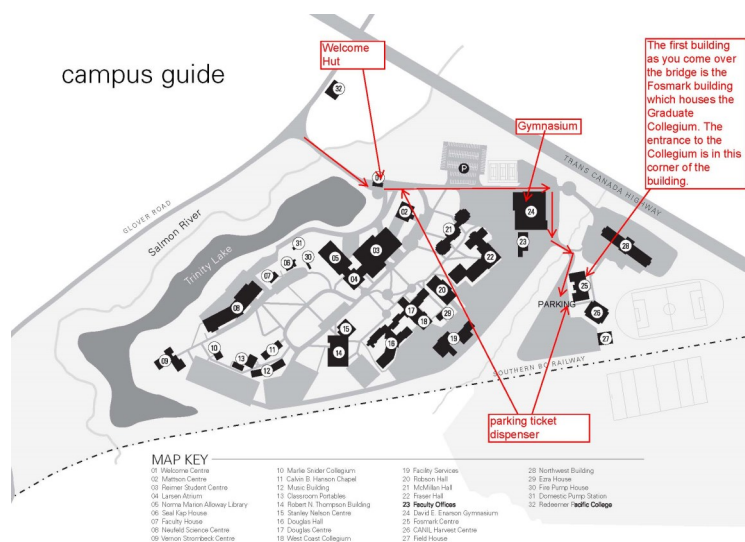
