### Dr. Richard (Rick) Sawatzky, PhD, RN



Dr. Richard Sawatzky holds a Canada Research Chair in Patient-Reported Outcomes at Trinity Western University and is research scientist with the University of British Columbia Centre for Health Evaluation and Outcome Sciences (CHÉOS). He leads a program of research on the validation and utilization of patient-reported outcomes (PROs) and quality of life assessments in contexts of care for people with chronic life-limiting illnesses. Current research activities include evaluating the validity of PRO instruments and computerized adaptive assessment systems, the use of tablet devices for PRO assessments, the selection and utilization of PROs, and a palliative approach to nursing care delivery.
