## **Revision Checklist**

**<u>Revision:</u>** Revising is reviewing your paper to make changes in content, organization, and structure.

Introduction
<ul> <li>Does the paper appeal to a specific audience?</li> <li>Is the context of the topic established?</li> <li>Does the argument of the paper respond to the assignment instructions?</li> </ul>
<u>Thesis</u>
<ul> <li>☐ Is your thesis clearly defined?</li> <li>☐ Does your thesis establish a purpose?</li> <li>☐ Does your thesis show your opinion on a topic?</li> <li>☐ Does your thesis use specific language?</li> <li>☐ Does your thesis make an assertion based on clearly stated support?</li> </ul>
<u>Organization</u>
<ul> <li>Does each body paragraph have a topic sentence that refers back to the thesis?</li> <li>Does each body paragraph develop only one idea?</li> <li>Does each body paragraph connect to the previous paragraph and the following paragraph?</li> <li>Does each body paragraph have a transition—either at the beginning or the end of the paragraph?</li> <li>Is third person point of view used? (He, she, one, they)</li> </ul>
Content and Development
<ul> <li>Does each body paragraph have evidence to support the claim in the topic sentence?</li> <li>Is each piece of evidence introduced and/or given context?</li> <li>Is each piece of evidence integrated into a sentence; in other words, there are no floating quotations?</li> <li>Is each piece of evidence interpreted, or analyzed, based on its relationship to your thesis?</li> </ul>

## **Editing Checklist**

**Editing:** Editing is reviewing your essay to address minor details and make changes in the writing, such as grammar, word choice, and mechanics.

<u>Grammar</u>
<ul> <li>Do the subjects and the verbs agree? Is the verb tense consistent throughout the entire paper? To check, identify your subjects and verbs.</li> <li>Do you use complete sentences? Check for fragments, run-ons, and comma splices.</li> <li>Do you use slang or jargon? Use academic vocabulary in your English paper.</li> <li>Do your sentences vary in length?</li> <li>Which voice do you use in your writing? Use active voice for your English paper.</li> <li>Is it clear what your pronouns refer to?</li> </ul>
<u>Mechanics</u>
<ul> <li>Do you overuse or underuse commas?</li> <li>Is your spelling correct?</li> <li>Do you use apostrophes correctly? Avoid contractions and check possessives.</li> <li>Are all other types of punctuation used correctly? (Question marks, exclamation points, semicolons, periods, etc.)</li> <li>Are words capitalized correctly?</li> <li>Are your sources cited correctly?</li> <li>Are quotations formatted and cited correctly?</li> </ul>
