My research program explores the arts as a way of knowing, expressing, healing, and disrupting in healthcare, and I have a focus on advancing arts-based responses to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission Calls to Action. My interests include arts-based research methods for health equity, arts and health interventions for psychosocial care, arts-based pedagogy, arts-based knowledge translation, and systematic reviews.
