ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

High School Students

The minimum requirement for admission (for students from BC) is graduation from high school with English 12 (or equivalent) and three additional approved Grade 12 courses. If you are from other Canadian provinces or the US, please check **twu.ca/admissions-aid**. All students must meet TWU's English proficiency standard.

Approved Academic Courses

Homeschool Students

Students enrolled with a blended learning school and set to graduate with a provincial high school diploma fall under regular provincial admissions requirements. Students who do not fulfill those requirements may complete the regular admission application and submit a Home Schooled Education Background chart.
